Cewch ddarganfod y drafnidiaeth, y deunyddiau a'r rhwydweithiau a oedd mor bwysig, a'r 'pethau mawr' a gyfrannodd gymaint at hanes diwydiannol ein cenedl.

Mae'r amgueddfa yn gartref i'r Robin Goch, un o awyrennau cynharaf y DU, yn ogystal â'n replica anhygoel o Injan Stêm Penydarren, y locomotif stêm cyntaf i dynnu cerbydau nwyddau!

Mwynhewch ein horielau, ein harddangosfeydd dros-dro, a'r arddangosiadau rhyngweithiol sy'n dod â hanes diwydiannol Cymru yn fyw.

TRAIL 1

Museum

Starting at the Cityside entrance from the side of the stunning 1923 Dodge motorcar, make your way through the Museum, housed in an original listed warehouse linked to an ultra-modern slate and glass building. Here you can discover the transport, materials and networks that were so important and the 'big things' that contributed so much to the industrial history of Wales.

The museum is home to the incredible Robin Goch, one of the earliest aircraft in the UK, and our amazing replica of the Penydarren Steam Engine, which was the first to prove a steam locomotive could haul a goods train!

Explore the galleries, enjoy our ever-changing exhibitions and explore Wales's industrial past through our interactive displays.

TRAIL 2

GRAFT Garden

Make your way from the Cityside entrance through the Main Hall towards the double doors on your left hand side which will lead you out into our GRAFT Garden.

The garden, built in collaboration with many community groups from in and around Swansea, is a sustainable, organic growing environment, creating an edible landscape to encourage participation and conversation, producing vegetables, fruits and herbs. The produce grown in the garden is donated to many groups throughout the area who provide food for those in need such as Matts House, Ogof Adullam and the Swansea refugee drop in center.

Marina

Marina Abertawe, lle mae'r môr yn cwrrd â'r ddinas.

Ewch allan o'r amgueddfa drwy fynedfa'r Marina, a chymryd eiliad i fwynhau'r olygfa - mae dwy long hanesyddol yn y doc, ynghyd ag amrywiaeth o gygod pysgota a chychod hwyllo. Sylwch ar yr Helwick, goleulog heb injan, oedd yn cael ei halio allan i'r môr.

TRAIL 3

Marina

Swansea Marina, where the city meets the sea.

Exit the National Waterfront Museum via the Marina entrance and take in the sight of the two historic vessels moored alongside a wide variety of yachts and fishing boats. Notice the Helwick, a lighthouse ship which has no engine and was towed out to sea.

Follow the path around the Marina, where you can take in a variety of independent shops and cafes as well as the iconic Meridan Tower. You will eventually reach the stunning statue of Captain Cat, the blind Sea Captain from Under Milk Wood and by crossing the Swing Bridge, you will see before you the Dylan Thomas Theatre and the statue of the famous Swansea-born bard and playwright.

As you continue to follow the path you will see the National Waterfront Museum standing proudly before you in our Marina home, ready to welcome you back with some refreshments and home made cakes in our café.
